

It was rape: Forensic proof nails Kasliwal

BANGALORE: Evidence collected by forensic experts during a series of tests conducted on Shree Ram Mills' scion indicates that Abhishek Kasliwal did rape the 52-year-old woman in March 11. "It was rape, not consensual sex," sources said.

Sources said the Worli police had been informed about the analysis and would receive a detailed print-out of the report soon.

Abhishek, who was arrested in Mumbai on charges of rape and assault, was brought to the Forensic Sciences Laboratory, Bangalore, for a polygraph test and brain mapping.

Both hospital director B M Mohan and deputy director S Malini said, "We have told the police that tests clearly point out that Kasliwal is guilty. Printed copies of the reports will be submitted to the police soon.

Kasliwal underwent a two-hour preliminary test interview, where he was asked to submit a written statement on the case.

This was followed by a polygraph test, where the variance of his blood pressure, pulse and galvanic skin responses electrical responses of the skin, which is highly sensitive to emotions were recorded on a running graph.

Finally, he was attached to 32 electrodes and shown pictures and words associated with the crime. His brain responses were noted down during this brain mapping test.

"We have collaborated all the data to make the analysis. It's not right on our part to disclose where he failed and how we collated the results as it could hamper investigation," the source added. Can these reports be produced as evidence in court?
